A Chanukah Message :

Chanukah and the Glow of Faith

It seems that the whole story of Chanukah is embodied in the spinning dreidel. Each of its four sides bears a distinct message which, unless read in its entirety, is meaningless. "Nes Gadol Hayah Sham - A Great Miracle Happened There". The tale of triumph that accompanies this festival seems to indicate that the Bnei Yisrael were less than totally victorious. True, the Chashmonaim defeated the Syrians and returned to the Beit Hamikdash. However, the nation was in turmoil. The Kohanim had displaced the tribe of Judah as the kings and leaders of Israel. There were still pockets of Hellenistic influence which affected the sanctity of Yerushalayim. Bribes were offered for the portion of Kohen Godol. Yet we still celebrate. Why? Moreover, why would the rabbis have future generations commemorate an event that has so many aspects unclarified? The answer is established in the fact that although a small amount of pure oil found in the Beit Hamikdash was only a meager manifestation of our victory, its significance transcends quantity. Chanukah, set in the winter, in a time when the night is the longest and the sun shines least, gives us the inspiration to go on. It tells us that we may only see a small part of the victory to come, but we must revel even in its tiniest part. It tells us that although when the dreidel falls we may only see one side, nevertheless; there are more victories that meet the eye. If we celebrate the drops of oil that can last only a fleeting moment, one day we will celebrate the glow of

the Ner Tamid in the Beit Hamikdash. May Hashem bless all of us with the capability to appreciate His handiwork in the framework of small moments and happenings as we grow to understand the large picture of life itself. Recipes:

It's hard to come up with original
recipes for Chanukah so let's stick
with the theme of potatoes:

Potato Kugel Muffins:

2 Tbsp. plus 6 tbsp oil

3 medium onions

5 lbs. Idaho potatoes

1 1/2 Tbsp. salt

1/2 tsp black pepper

1 - 2 tsp. paprika

5 eggs, lightly beaten

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Chop
onions. Heat 2 tbsp oil in skillet and
sauté until clear to light brown.

Using 2 (12 form) muffin pans, place
1/4 tsp oil in each muffin cup. Heat
in oven for 5 to 7 minutes. Coarsely
grate potatoes; press out excess liquid.

Add eggs, sautéed onions, salt and
pepper to potatoes. Pour mixture into
the hot oil, filling each muffin 3/4
full. Sprinkle paprika on top. Bake
for 5 minutes, then reduce
temperature to 350 degrees for 30 to
40 minutes or until medium brown.

Creamy Scalloped Potatoes:

4 -6 medium potatoes

Salt and pepper to taste

3 Tbsp margarine

3 Tbsp flour

2 tsp instant chicken soup mix

1 1/2 boiling water

paprika

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Slice
potatoes very thinly. Arrange layers
of potatoes in a well-greased 2 quart
casserole. Sprinkle each layer with
salt and pepper. Over medium heat,
melt margarine. Add flour and soup
mix; mix until smooth. Add boiling
water and cook over medium heat,
stirring until bubbly and thick. Add
salt and pepper to taste. Pour hot
sauce over potatoes. Sprinkle with
paprika. Bake, covered, for 45, then
uncovered for 30 minutes, or until
tender and golden brown.
